We are continuing the Green Workplace Assessments, with an ambitious semester goal of 4 assessments across Humboldt State's campus. We are outreaching to different departments through Humboldt NOW, a campus-wide newspaper, weekly announcements to faculty and staff, and with flyers to get the word out about what we plan to accomplish.

The GWA program is designed to teach and raise awareness to the Humboldt State community regarding energy efficiency and sustainable practices that can be implemented in their offices. The implementation of the GWA Certification is in place to reward offices that are taking the extra initiative to be sustainably minded. Another goal is to enlighten other office departments that are interested in becoming more environmentally conscious in their workplace.

The program assesses offices in 7 specific areas in which a workplace can implement sustainable practices to reduce their carbon footprint. These areas include energy, water conservation,

recycling and waste management, purchasing, transportation, community involvement, and creative & innovation options. Each action within these categories is rewarded with a certain value of points. The total of these points combined will give your office a Certification of GWA Certified, Bronze, Silver, or Gold.

The project was successfully piloted last semester with the certification of 4 Humboldt State workplaces. These offices include:

- 1. Housing and Dining: Housing Grounds with Bronze Certification
- 2. Student Health Center with Silver Certification
- 3. Schatz Energy Research Center with Gold Certification
- 4. Environmental Science Department is in the process of being certified from last semester.

Green Campus and EEC council have registered five residence halls on campus to compete in the 2012 Campus Conservation Nationals (CCN). CCN is the first nationwide electricity and water reduction competition on college and university campuses. Overall the competition's goal is to give a common voice and motivation to thousands of students all working together to reduce consumption and mitigate the impacts of climate change. Lucid Design, the main organizers of the competition, has set a national challenge goal of 1 gigawatt-hour with cumulative savings from all participants. This is the second year the competition is being held, and last year Humboldt State won the national water reduction competition!

Between February 6th-26th The Hill, Canyon, College Creek, and Creekview will be competing both nationally and locally against the other residence halls on campus. Let Green Campus know if you're interested in being a "dorm captain" and promoting this event in your residence hall.
